



## National Patrol Camp 2025 – Bulletin 01

#### Introduction

The National Patrol Camp 2025 will bring together Scouts and Leaders from across the Maldives for an enriching program of adventure, learning, and fellowship. This camp is designed to strengthen Scouting values, enhance patrol spirit, and provide an opportunity to share skills and experiences in a truly national setting. The National Patrol Camp 2025 will bring together a total of **442 participants**, consisting of **51 Scout Groups from 17 Atolls**. Among them are **368 Scouts** and **74 Leaders**, reflecting strong nationwide representation and active leadership support.

## Camp Theme & Badge

The badge for the National Patrol Camp 2025, to be held at Kudagiri, embodies the camp's theme of "Back to Basics - Rediscovering the Spirit of Scouting." It reflects the essence of patrol-based outdoor adventure and the timeless values of Scouting. At the center, the design showcases two Scouts working together on a



pioneering project, symbolizing teamwork, skill-building, and the hands-on learning that lies at the heart of Scouting. The Scout emblem is prominently featured, reaffirming the values of unity, leadership, and service. The background illustrates a natural camp setting with green fields, trees, and a pitched tent, capturing the simplicity of life in the outdoors where Scouts will camp, cook, and live as patrols. The compass markings around the border emphasize exploration, direction, and the sense of adventure that guides Scouts through every camp experience. Together, the design reinforces the return to core Scouting traditions while encouraging participants to reconnect with the spirit of resilience, self-reliance, and brotherhood.

- Utensils: Each group must bring their own utensils for cooking.
- Gas Cooker and Gas Bottle will be provided.

#### SAMPLE KITCHEN LIST FOR EACH SUB CAMP

## Cooking Equipment

- Large stock pots (at least 3, 20-40 qt capacity)
- Large frying pans / skillets (multiple, 12"+ size)
- **Griddles / flat tops** (for hotdogs, sandwiches etc.)
- Large water containers (5–10 gallons each, at least 2)

## **\ Utensils & Tools**

- Serving spoons (8–10, solid and slotted)
- Ladles (3–5, for soups, stews, sauces)

- **Tongs** (5–8 pairs)
- **Spatulas** (6–10, both metal and silicone)
- Can openers (2-3 heavy-duty)
- **Peelers** (4-6)
- Knives (Chef's and paring knives) (4-6 sets)
- Cutting boards (5-8 large boards)
- Colanders / Strainers (2-3 large)
- Mixing bowls (5–8, various sizes)
- Measuring cups and spoons (3-4 sets)
- The above utensils list is provided for guidance. Discuss among the Scout Groups in the Sub-Camp and finalize utensils.

#### 5. Kit List

- All Scouts and Leaders are required to bring their own mess kit to the camp. Each mess kit should include the following:
  - Plate
  - Cup
  - Fork
  - Spoon
- Scout groups are required to prepare their own kit list based on the program provided.







## Mandatory Training – Safe from Harm & Listening Ear

To ensure a safe environment for all participants All Scout Leaders and Volunteers must complete the following:

- Safe from Harm 1:
  - Safe from Harm-1: Essential Learnings
- Safe from Harm B (Listening Ear):
  - o Safe from Harm-B: Listening Ear Course
- Certification Submission: All certifications must be submitted to the Scout Association of Maldives via the following link:

This training equips leaders and volunteers with the knowledge and skills to ensure a secure and supportive environment for all Scouts.

## Listening Ear Initiative

Listening Ears will be designated throughout the camp to provide support and ensure open communication.

- Leaders from participating groups will be assigned this role on a duty basis.
- To prepare, all Leaders must complete Safe from Harm-B.
- The initiative ensures Scouts have a safe space to share concerns, seek guidance, and receive support during camp.

All Adults are required to complete the mandatory Safe from Harm trainings and ensure that the corresponding certificates are submitted to the Scout Association of Maldives before the camp. Scout groups must also prepare the necessary utensil sets and finalize their kit lists in accordance with the program requirements. Additionally, it is essential to closely follow reporting updates, as any changes or instructions will be communicated in advance.
